

Renton Rotary selects Youth of the Month

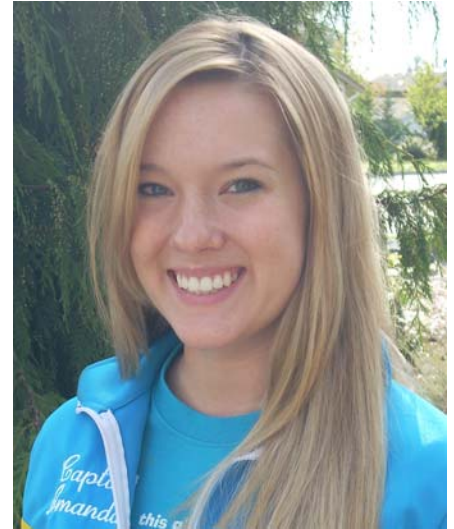
November 2008—Rotary Club of Renton has selected their Youth of the Month for November.
