A GUIDE TO VOLUNTEERING

Why Volunteer?

1. The experience of giving your time and service to others demonstrates good character and a chance to reap many personal rewards by giving of yourself to those in need. You will feel good about yourself and help others.
2. Volunteering gives you a chance to learn new skills, explore career options, meet new people and make new friends.
3. Many college admissions and scholarship awards are granted to students who demonstrate service to others. This is often a deciding factor in selection.

How do I decide where to volunteer?

When deciding where you would like to volunteer, you should always consider your personal skills, experiences and interests. Try to choose a volunteer opportunity in which your abilities can best be used.

Here are some things to consider:

What is your Career Pathway?

Pathways are broad groupings of careers that have similar characteristics and employment requirements. They provide a useful framework to aid students in career exploration and can help focus on courses of study based on personal interests.

- **Arts and Communication**
Focuses on creativity. It is about ideas and expression of those ideas in new and innovative ways through a variety of mediums.
- **Business and Marketing**
This pathway allows students the opportunity to explore, prepare, and become proficient within the business field and occupations related to sales and marketing.
- **Health and Human Services**
This pathway is about working with people. It includes an assortment of careers at all levels of education and training. Some examples are teachers, lawyers, health care professionals, child care workers, cosmetologists and chefs.
- **Science and Natural Resources**
Opportunities in literacy and/or technical knowledge and skills in agriculture, natural resources, horticulture, and the environment.
- **Technology and Engineering**
This pathway prepares students to produce, process, assemble, test, maintain, service and/or repair products.

- Ask about the training and the supervision you will receive.
- If expenses are an issue, discuss whether the organization has a policy of reimbursement.
- Discuss the philosophy of the organization enough to know you will be proud to be associated with it.
