# **Safe Storage: Medication & Poisons**

### **Medication Storage Guidelines**

- Put medicines, household cleaning products, and other dangerous substances out of children's reach and sight.
- For older children and teens, lock medication and poisons in a secure container or device. If the device has a key, keep it with you or in a safe place unauthorized users cannot access.
- Put medicines and household products away after every use. Never leave medicine out on a counter or at a sick child's bedside.
- Always relock the cap on a medicine bottle. If the bottle has a locking cap that turns, twist it until you hear the click or cannot twist anymore.
- Teach your children about medicine safety. Never tell children medicine is candy, even if they don't like to take their medicine.
- Ask family members, houseguests, and other visitors to keep purses, bags, or coats that have medicine in them up and away and out of sight in your home.

# **Safe Storage: Firearms**

#### **Firearm Safe Storage Guidelines**

- Store firearms locked and unloaded.
- Use a gun safe, gun lock box, a trigger lock or a chamber lock. These devices are available from many firearm retailers and outdoor sporting goods stores.
- Store and lock ammunition in a separate place.
- If your locking device has a key, keep it with you or in a safe place that unauthorized users cannot access.
- Remove firearms from your home if you have a depressed or suicidal family member or frequent visitor.
- Ask family and friends to also use these safe storage steps.

Ask before your child visits. "If you have a firearm in your home, is it stored locked and unloaded?" Ask if the ammunition is stored separately. Ask about shotguns and rifles too, not just handguns. If you have doubts about the safety of someone else's home, invite them to visit your home instead.

**Talk with your child.** In addition to storing your firearms locked and unloaded, talk with your young children about the risk of firearm injury. Teach your child if she or he finds a firearm to leave it alone and tell an adult right away.

# **Safe Disposal: Firearms**

## **Police Departments**

At the Seattle Police Department or the Renton Police Department, individuals can make walk-in appointments to turn in unwanted guns or ammunition. When turning over a firearm:

- 1. Call ahead and let officers know you have items to bring in for destruction.
- 2. If you know how to safely unload the firearm before bringing it into the precinct, please do so.
- 3. Please do not bring a visible firearm into the precinct. Put the firearm in a bag or a box and tell the officer at the front desk that you are bringing a firearm in for destruction. Don't remove the firearm from the bag/box.
- 4. If you have a long gun or rifle, call the non-emergency number 206-625-5011 and ask that officers be dispatched to your location to pick up your weapon.
