Dear Preschool Families of Students with Disabilities,

Instruction in the form of virtual learning is being developed to support students and families during this closure. This includes special education and related services, such as speech language therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy.

- Special education services and accommodations will be provided via virtual learning, as appropriate for your child.
- The Meadow Crest teachers will make reasonable efforts to make virtual learning resources accessible to students with disabilities.
- Virtual instruction will not look the same as classroom instruction.
- Focus will be on progress toward IEP goals and providing access to the general education curriculum delivered.

Our school has in-home learning resources on the Meadow Crest webpage, https://meadowcrest.rentonschools.us/for-families/in-home-learning. Special education teachers and related services providers (e.g. OTs, PTs, SLPs) are developing resources for these school pages. Each week you will find activities for literacy, math, social/emotional, motor, routines, adaptive/self-help, as well as ideas from our Speech/Language Pathologists (SLPs) and Occupational and Physical Therapists. (OTs and PTs). Many activities will include ways to adapt the instruction if your child is not quite ready for the activity or needs more of a challenge. Additionally, teachers and related service providers are available via email, phone and video conferencing. Teachers and therapists will be working with you to develop the supports that are most appropriate for your child.

Here you can find the Preschool Resource from University of Washington, as well as additional resources for Students with Disabilities and Social/Emotional Learning. Continue to check out these sites weekly, as we will be adding additional resources as they become available.

Our educators, therapists, office support, and administrators are working virtually during normal school hours.
